1. Why do you think the author wrote this book?
2. What is the message or theme of this book? Do you think the message is true, based on a biblical perspective? Why or why not?
3. Do you think the author of the book is a Christian? Why or why not?
4. What truths did you see in this book that we can apply as Christians, even if the book was not an overtly Christian book?
5. How do you think the thoughts, actions, or lives of one or more characters in the book would be different if they had a relationship with Christ?
6. What would you say to the author or a character from the book if you could talk to them?
7. How do the ideas in this book compare to the Truth you have learned from the Bible?
8. Do you think the characters in your book behave in ways that reflect what the Bible teaches? Why or why not?

## Questions for Fantasy, Science Fiction, or Dystopian Genres

### 1. The nature of God

- Who is "god" in this book?
- How does the "god" in the book compare to the God of the Bible?
- In what ways might technology or government be taking on the role of God in this book?

### 2. Creation

- How has sin impacted God's creation in this book?
- What value is placed on God's creation in the book?
- What dangers exist due to any technological advances described in the book?

### 3. Mankind

- What value is placed on human life in the book?
- How has sin impacted human life and purpose in the book?

### 4. Moral Order

- Who defines the moral order in the society/world described in the book?
- How does the existing moral order line up with God's definitions as described in the Bible?
- What potential for misuse is evident regarding any technological advances described in the book?

### 5. Purpose

- What is the purpose or meaning of human life according to the book?
- How does this compare with God's purposes for us as Christians?
